Point No. 4 - Admission process for the academic year 2022-2023 -Mrs. Maya Sawant informed about the admission process for the academic year 2022-23

The admission notice was published in the newspaper- Times Of India on 15th November 2021 and also published on the school website www.cityprideschool.com, it was also put up on the school notice board. Admission process for LKG for the academic year 2022-2023 started in first week of December.

Being a Konkani Linguistic Minority school, preference is given to Konkani Linguistic Minority students, siblings and teacher's ward. The LKG admission process was completed as per Govt. norms on 3rd Jan 2022. The list of students was put up on the same day on the school notice board and displayed on the

website too. The parents of selected students were asked to complete the admission process. The UKG admission process was also completed at the same time.

Admission process for higher standards as per vacancies created was initiated after 16th Jan for the academic year 2022-2023. Baseline test was conducted for the applicants. Admissions was given on merit basis only.

Point No. 5 - Staff recruitment for the academic year 2022-2023 - Madam further mentioned about the staff recruitment for the academic year 2022-23 Staff recruitment (teaching and non-teaching staff) for the academic year 2022-2023 was done as per the need analysis of the school for. Advertisement was given in local newspaper for the same on 15th November 2021 and the same was displayed on the school website. Interviews, written exams and demos were conducted accordingly for the shortlisting the candidates.

Point no. 6 – Any other points –

- **Book Bank** – Management Representative Dr. Ashwini Kulkarni, mentioned about the Book Exchange Programme which was suggested by many parents' representatives. The whole idea behind this was to imbibe the concept of Reuse of books. She mentioned that during the last two years of pandemic, majority of the students have hardly handled their text books due to which there is no wear and tear of the books and the books are in good condition. These books can certainly be used by exchanging them with the previous standard students. The parents have the option of selling the complete set of books at 50% discount to those who are interested. To do so, details of parents who wish to exchange their books will be shared with the previous class parents by filling the google form. School will just act as a mediator in exchange of contact information between two sets of parents. The school in NO way will be responsible for the condition of the books and the financial transactions. A detailed note regarding the same will be sent by the school in the month of Feb. 2022.
- The lower standard books cannot be included in this programme because a lot of writing is done in the text books and work books itself, hence these cannot be exchanged. Mrs. Bharti Bhatia, a parent member, appreciated the idea of Book Bank and felt that this drive will help parents as well as students. Other parents also appreciated this idea.
- **Physical Re-opening of the school –** Management Representative, Dr. Ashwini Kulkarni, emphasized the need of physical re-opening of the school after two years of pandemic. She further stated, post opening of the school as per the Govt. directives we expect all the children to come to school on their own. The school is ready to provide the bus facility also.
- Further Management Representative, Dr. Ashwini Kulkarni stated that, this time keeping pandemic situation in mind we would change the pattern of our Final Examination, which will be conducted in the month of March 2022. We would term it as 'Diagnostic Test'. This examination would be based on basic concept understanding rather than just rote learning. The reason of conducting such a test is to identify the learning gaps and work on building up conceptual understanding. So in the month of April 2023, the teachers would not rush to start the new syllabus but work on building up the learning gaps of the previous academic year.
- Mrs Mrinalini Gholap, a teacher member highlighted the fact how online schooling has considerably caused an adverse impact on the students confidence and how important it is now for the teachers to play a crucial role in getting their confidence back, so that students not only give exams with same zeal and enthusiasm but also participate in other activities. Mrs. Bharati Bhatia, a parent member, gave her own example saying that being cut off from rest of the world during pandemic caused impact on her confidence and the same is seen in students who are re-joining the school after a long time.


Finally, Management Representative Dr. Ashwini Kulkarni, emphasized that, this academic year will be more of concept learning and identifying gaps, bridging them rather than completing the syllabus. And the need of conceptual leaning will continue for couple of months before things are back to normal.

Dr. Pushkar Khair, a parent member appreciated this thought and has the same opinion of conducting diagnostic test, which would help to enhance conceptual learning and boost the confidence of our students.

Mrs. Philicina Thakur, a teacher member, said that the parents who have children in Std 1st should send them to school because these children have neither seen school or attended physical school.

- Management Representative, Dr. Ashwini Kulkarni, mentioned that our school would have its Theme for the next academic year as 'WATER'. All the activities will be based on this theme. Details regarding this would be shared later.
- **Point No 7 - Vote of Thanks:** Mrs. Divya Pillai, a teacher representative proposed vote of thanks and announced the next EPTA meeting in March 2022.
